OPSI RESOLUTION #2023-01 HONORING JUDITH WILLIAMS JAGDMANN

WHEREAS, Judith Williams Jagdmann was elected by the Virginia General Assembly to serve as the 33rd Commissioner of the Virginia State Corporation Commission (“SCC”) in 2006, and was reelected in 2012 and 2018, serving in that capacity for almost 17 years; and

WHEREAS, prior to being elected Commissioner to the SCC Judge Jagdmann was the 43rd Attorney General for the Commonwealth of Virginia, serving from 2005-2006; as such, was the second woman to serve as Attorney General; and

WHEREAS, from 1998-2005, Judge Jagdmann served as the Deputy Attorney General for the Civil Litigation Division, a position that included the Anti-trust and Utility Consumer Counsel Divisions; and

WHEREAS, before her work in the Office of Attorney General, she served for 13 years as counsel to the SCC and its staff on securities and utility matters; and

WHEREAS, Judge Jagdmann served three terms as a Virginia State Corporation Commissioner; and

WHEREAS, Judge Jagdmann is regarded by colleagues as someone who epitomizes the term “public servant” and who has tremendous respect for the Commonwealth of Virginia and its citizens, as well as the Commission and the vital importance of its function, history, tradition, and employees; and

WHEREAS, Judge Jagdmann was very active in the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC), where she chaired the Electricity Committee from 2017 until she was elected 2nd Vice President for the 2019-20 term; and

WHEREAS, in 2018 she chaired the NARUC Task Force on Military Workforce Development and represented NARUC at the World Energy Forum; and

WHEREAS, Judge Jagdmann served as NARUC President from November 2021 to November 2022; and

WHEREAS, Judge Jagdmann has also been a leader in regional regulatory organizations serving as President of the Mid-Atlantic Conference of Regulatory Utilities Commissioners (2017-18); and

WHEREAS, Judge Jagdmann has served as the Virginia member of the Organization of PJM States, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, colleagues admire Judge Jagdmann's sound advice, caring nature, pragmatism, focus on the positive, ability to balance all sides of an issue, and her commitment to ensuring civility and professionalism; and

WHEREAS, Judge Jagdmann has served as a mentor and teacher to countless regulators and staff using her experience and charm to motivate performance; and

WHEREAS, Judge Jagdmann consistently had the right words and the right tone to help her colleagues through difficult moments and difficult topics, knowing just what to say; and

WHEREAS, Judge Jagdmann is a graduate of the University of Virginia and the University of Richmond School of Law; and

WHEREAS, Judge Jagdmann serves as adjunct faculty teaching energy policy and regulation at the University of Virginia School of Law.

NOW, therefore, be it resolved, the OPSI Board of directors, Commissioners and staff congratulate Judge Jagdmann, on her tenure at the Virginia SCC and on the OPSI Board and offer heartfelt thanks for her years of public service, leadership in regulatory forums, sage counsel, humor, and southern charm and wish Judge Jagdmann the very best in her future endeavors¹.
