**UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
AND REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED CONSIDERATION
OF PARSEC AND PJM TRANSMISSION OWNERS**

Pursuant to Rules 212 and 2008 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“FERC” or the “Commission”)¹ and Order No. 1920-A,² the PJM Area Relevant State Entities Committee (“PARSEC”)³ and the PJM Transmission Owners,⁴ submit this unopposed motion for an additional extension to the Engagement Period and deadline for the PJM Transmission Owners to make the cost allocation compliance filing under Order No. 1920. The PARSEC respectfully requests that the Commission extend the Engagement Period between the PJM Transmission Owners and the PARSEC. To accommodate PARSEC’s request for extension of the Engagement Period, the PJM Transmission Owners request a sixty-day additional extension to the compliance deadline for submitting a cost allocation compliance filing, extending the deadline to August 11, 2026.

PARSEC and the PJM Transmission Owners additionally request that as part of the sixty-day extension, the Commission make available to the PARSEC and the PJM Transmission

Owners the Commission’s Dispute Resolution Service should they agree to call upon it for forty-five days or until a mutual agreement is reached between the parties, whichever occurs first.⁵ At the conclusion of the forty-five day period, if mutual agreement is not reached, the Engagement Period will end, absent mutual agreement of the PARSEC and PJM Transmission Owners to extend it. And the PJM Transmission Owners will submit their filing on August 11, 2026, and any attachments the PARSEC provides to them consistent with the requirements of Order No. 1920-A.

As the PJM Transmission Owners’ compliance filing in this proceeding is due June 12, 2026, PARSEC and the PJM Transmission Owners respectfully request that the Commission enter an order on this motion before June 8, 2026. That is the date that the PJM Transmission Owners have scheduled a meeting to vote on their proposed backstop *ex ante* cost allocation. As the only interested parties to this request, and joint movants, the PJM Transmission Owners and PARSEC also request the Commission shorten or waive the answer period to this motion to allow an Order before June 8, 2026. To this end, if the Commission chooses to notice a date for answers, the Transmission Owners and PARSEC request that any answers be due on Friday, June 5, 2026.

Under Rule 2008 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure, “the time by which any person is required or allowed to act under any statute, rule, or order may be extended by the decisional authority for good cause, upon a motion made before the expiration of the period prescribed or previously extended.”⁶ Further, in Order No. 1920-A, the Commission wrote that it will grant an extension request when RSEs request more time to have “sufficient

time to engage in fulsome discussions.”⁷ Order No. 1920-A also stated that the Commission would, as appropriate, extend cost allocation compliance deadlines to accommodate an extended Engagement Period.⁸

The Commission has twice previously extended the compliance deadline and Engagement Period, with the current compliance deadline set for June 12, 2026. PARSEC and the PJM Transmission Owners believe that an additional extension, with the opportunity to make use of mediation discussed herein, is appropriate in an attempt to reach consensus to develop and implement an *ex ante* Long-Term Regional Transmission Cost Allocation Method applicable to a region as diverse as PJM, encompassing 13 states and the District of Columbia.

For the above stated reasons, the PARSEC and the PJM Transmission Owners request the Commission grant this motion before June 8, 2026 for an additional extension to the Engagement Period and deadline for the PJM Transmission Owners to submit a cost allocation compliance filing to August 11, 2026, without setting a date for other parties to respond, and make the Commission’s Dispute Resolution Service available if requested by the parties.
